As you wandered away following your own selfish desires, he never changed: his arms stayed outstretched on the cross to welcome you back.

But, there was something missing: "When I look back – I was never satisfied with any of these girls...I **concluded that the only perfect** 'spouse' for me...was Jesus Christ." Notice that you did not reach this conclusion in an intellectual analysis only – but in your inner being there was an "intuitive sense" that this was true. And it was strong enough to lead you to take the bold action to step forward as a lay volunteer.

There in the chapel of the Cathedral..."I began to cry...I was overcome with **fear** and sadness over the fact I had to leave my mom and dad, my family and friends, my dog, my house..." Then: "I can't do this, I'll just die."

Then, "I heard a voice, a vocal voice, "Die for me and I will give you life." "My eyes came to rest on the crucifix that was hanging above the tabernacle. The anxiety, fear, sadness ...were gone."

"I was filled with peace and calm."

"My MANTRA in rough times has been, 'Die for me and I will give you life."

Let's connect a few dots: the good Lord - the Lord of the universe has been courting you! You recognized it earlier on when you knew "in your gut" that no girl will ever be able to satisfy you. Jesus is calling you to a SPOUSAL RELATIONSHIP with him. Remember the old saying, "Two's a couple, three's a crowd?" That holds true in this spousal relationship too. It is an exclusive bond between you and the Lord Jesus. His wishes, his desires become your wishes, your desires. AND THERE WILL BE AN ABIDING PEACE AND JOY despite trials and temptations.

You now know experientially 1) you have been blessed and surrounded by love all your life, beginning with your family. 2) You know beyond any doubt that God himself loves you: his love has been without end – he has forgiven you, wiped the slate clean, and in response, you have responded in love – the call to serve Jesus in the poor. "What shall I return to the Lord for all he has done for me?" (The psalms).
